He has served on the Interfaith Advisory Board of the World Council of Churches and is a member of the Archbishop of Canterbury's Building-Bridges study group.

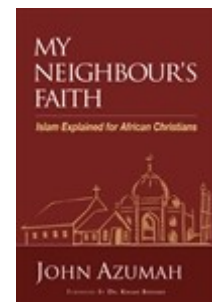
